He was deployed many times, to Afghanistan in 2009 and 2010. During his deployment in Afghanistan Mike was servilely injured, requiring 22 surgeries. Mike was awarded the combat action badge, and numerous awards for meritorious service during combat operations, in a hostile environment.

This year, I would like us to try to identify and locate the families of the almost 1,800 MIA/POWs in Wisconsin. The UW-Madison MIA/POW Recovery and Identification Project works to recover, identify, and repatriate MIA US service members by conducting field excavations and research assistance to those families. We will learn more about them throughout my term of office. On a local level, we need to reach out to these families and let them know we have not forgotten; nor will we forget, the service and sacrifice they have made. We need to give them a safe place to remember their loved ones; to speak about their experiences and pain; and to honor the service and sacrifice made by these men and women. We know the horrors of war, the waiting for news, the loss that is part of sacrifice and service. Reach out to them – let them know they are not alone and that we care and love them. They are part of the family.

My second project is the Auxiliary Emergency Fund – the only fund set up exclusively for Auxiliary members. Started in Wisconsin, this fund continues to offer hope, love, and financial support to auxiliary members in good standing for at least three years. My goal is to raise \$1.00 for every American Legion family member in the Department. Send your donations to Department Headquarters directly to be included in the goal. Those contributing \$100.00 or more will receive a special recognition pin. Thank you for your support. CHILDREN & YOUTH

Jocelyn Townsend is a little firecracker at the age of three. In October of 2023, while taking pictures for her birthday, her mom noticed something unusual about the photos. There was a white glow in her right eye. After a consultation with a specialist in Hudson, Wisconsin, Jocelyn was immediately referred to an eye specialist at the University of Minnesota. After tests and an MRI it was determined that Jocelyn had Retinoblastoma, an early childhood eye cancer. After learning of the heartbreaking news, the family had to make a quick decision. The cancer had progressed quickly, and with fear that it could spread beyond the eye, the decision was made to remove her eye. After weeks of recovery, she was fitted with an artificial eye. As you can tell by the picture, she has made the adjustment just fine, and still is a little firecracker! She loves her ALF Dog!

Carter Callow age 6 was born with Hydrocephalus. Day 2 of his life they placed a shunt in his head to drain the fluid. During his first year, he has had 13 different surgeries or medical procedures. When he was about 3 years old, the doctors at Children's of Minnesota performed a skull reduction surgery. This was an 8 hr. surgery and groundbreaking. Usually this procedure would be 2 major surgeries, but with 2 doctors working on each side, they did it in one day. They did discover that during the surgery, he suffered a minor stroke. This set him back about 5 weeks. Finally, his parents saw him smile again and play with his favorite toy. Carter struggles with seizures, and a multitude of other medical issues on an ongoing basis. He just can't seem to get a break. Please keep him in your prayers. He also received an ALF dog.
