After 34 years of service, Kathryn and 23 others were inducted and attended the reception and ceremony at Fort Benning, Georgia. Kathryn retired in 2017 as a Colonel in the US Army Logistics Branch.

HIGHLIGHT OUR HERO'S

PFC Harold H. Ziehme from Elmwood Post #207. Harold joined the National Guard and registered for the draft in 1940. He was inducted into the Army in 1943. He qualified as an M-1 sharpshooter. He volunteered for, and was accepted into the newly formed Ranger Battalion, serving with the Fifth Ranger Battalion Company F. He served during the invasion of Normandy,

and in Northern France and Rheinland Germany. He is credited as being a hero, earning a Purple Heart, Oak Leaf Cluster, and other service ribbons. On Dec. 4th, 1944, while in Germany he was severely wounded and left for dead. He was found alive the next morning by a Canadian Squad. He was transferred to a hospital in England, for surgery and six weeks of recovery. He finally received his honorable discharge in 1945. We salute Harold!

Kathryn VanderMolen from Cadott Post/Unit #159. (Dual Member) Kathryn served 34 years in the U.S. Army Logistics Branch. She retired as rank of Colonel. She was the first women to join the Cadott Legion Post #159, and first women to serve as Commander. Her and her husband Richard volunteer many hours at Camp American Legion! YOUTH HERO AWARD

Ryan Beierman and his 12-year-old son Owen of River Falls thought they would embark on a normal hunting and fishing trip to their cabin, when everything changed in a hurry. The two left to hunt bear around 6pm when Ryan briefly spotted a bear. After quickly escaping their vision, Owen eventually spotted the bear, and his dad gave him the okay to take a shot. The bear started spinning in circles and biting where he had been shot and ran off. They began to track the bear with their neighbor's tracking dog. After some time they arrived at a small opening and the dog became startled. There stood the bear in a pounce type position. Ryan started to draw his sidearm and never got to pull the gun up when the bear knocked him to the ground. He hit the bear with his 10mm pistol as hard as he could a few times, but it felt like punching a brick wall. Nothing was working and the bear took its turn on the offensive. The bear was coming towards my face with claws and teeth. I instinctively put my right arm up in front of my face to block it, when I heard the crunch of the first bite. Ryan's cheek had been sliced open. The world of pressure all fell into the hands of Owen to help his dad. Owen fired at the bear, ultimately allowing his dad to break free. Ryan remembers hearing the muzzle report, then seeing the flash, and then the bear moving from on top of me. Ryan had some major wounds to his face and arm and received many stitches.
